


# U.S. Change in Total Employment Through March 2023











## Total by Sector




## Connecticut Pandemic Losses

February 2020 to April 2020




April 2020 to March 2023




Connecticut Employment Change  
February 2020 to March 2023









Child Day Care  
Not Seasonally Adjusted




Restaurants and Other Eating Places







Connecticut Employment  
All Industries by Age Group





Manufacturing Industry





Connecticut Employment  
Health Care & Social Assistance Industry



Educational Services by Age Group



Public Administration -- 2nd Quarter 2022





Transportation and Warehousing by Age Group






Connecticut Employment  
By Race and Ethnicity







# U.S. Labor Force Projections

## By Age Group




# U.S. Labor Force Projections

## CT Department of Labor Economic Report

Commissioner Danté Bartolomeo today released March 2023 labor data indicating that the state's economy remains strong with economists monitoring national indicators such as inflation, interest rates, and instability in the banking sector. Connecticut's unemployment rate is low and unchanged at 4.0%; the state's employers added 1,100 jobs with more than half of the hiring happening across local, state, and federal governments –sectors that have lagged in pandemic recovery.



**Industry Sectors** with the most job postings were **Health Care and Social Assistance** (20,782 postings), **Retail Trade** (7,187 posting), **Manufacturing** (7,168 postings), and **Finance & Insurance** (6,280 postings).







### What they do:

Analyze specifications, lay out metal stock, set up and operate machine tools, and fit and assemble parts to make and repair dies, cutting tools, jigs, fixtures, gauges, and machinists' hand tools.

### On the job, you would:

- Verify dimensions, alignments, and clearances of finished parts for conformance to specifications, using measuring instruments such as calipers, gauge blocks, micrometers, or dial indicators.
- Set up and operate conventional or computer numerically controlled machine tools such as lathes, milling machines, or grinders to cut, bore, grind, or otherwise shape parts to prescribed dimensions and finishes.
- Visualize and compute dimensions, sizes, shapes, and tolerances of assemblies, based on specifications.


