Connecticut's jobless rate declines to 6.0%; monthly job gain streak hits 11 (+5,600)

WETHERSFIELD, December 16, 2021 – Connecticut's payroll employment increased by 5,600 (0.3%) in November 2021 to a seasonally adjusted level of 1,624,200. Connecticut industry employment is now 48,800 (3.1%) positions higher than the November 2020 job estimate (1,575,400). This is the eleventh consecutive monthly gain in 2021 for a 4,855 monthly average pace and a total of 53,400 jobs added year-to-date. Connecticut has now recovered 75.3% (220,300) of the 292,400 positions lost in the March and April 2020 COVID lockdown period. October 2021 job gains were revised higher by 1,800 to a 7,100 (0.4%) gain. The monthly statewide industry job estimates are produced by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) from a rotating probability sample of worksites in the state.

"Eleven consecutive months of job growth matches a record set in early 2015. Jobs have increased by more than 5,000 per month in each of the past three months," said Patrick Flaherty, Director of the Office of Research at the Connecticut Department of Labor. "The unemployment rate continues to fall rapidly even as the labor force is expanding."

The **private sector** increased employment by 4,400 jobs (0.3%) to 1,398,700 in November 2021 and is now higher by 48,500 positions (3.6%) since November 2020. The **government** *supersector* was also higher by 1,200 jobs (0.5%) in November to a level of 225,500. This is now 300 (0.1%) positions higher than November 2020. The government *supersector* includes all federal, state, and local employment, including public education and Native American casino employment located on tribal reservation land.

Nine of the ten major industry *supersectors* produced employment gains and one declined in November.

Connecticut Labor Market Areas (LMAs): Four out of the six Connecticut *LMAs*, that are seasonally adjusted by the BLS, posted employment gains, while two regional labor markets posted small job declines in November 2021. The *New Haven LMA* (0.7%, 293,000) increased employment by 1,900 to lead regional employment gains last month. The *Waterbury LMA* (0.8%, 66,100) was next, adding 500 positions. The *Norwich-New London-Westerly LMA* (0.2%, 118,400) added 200 jobs and the *Bridgeport-Stamford-Norwalk LMA* (0.03%, 383,000) also chipped in 100 jobs (after a large upwardly revised gain of 4,100 last month, 1.1%). The *Hartford LMA* (-0.1%, 557,400) was lower by 300 positions and the *Danbury LMA* (-0.1%, 73,400) dropped 100 jobs.

Note: The six major Connecticut LMAs are estimated independently from the statewide data by the BLS and cover more than 90% of the nonfarm employment in the state. Thus, estimates will not fully sum to the statewide total.

Hours and Earnings: The November 2021 **private sector** workweek, not seasonally adjusted, averaged 34.1 hours, this is down three-tenths of an hour from the November 2020 level (-0.9%, 34.4). Average hourly earnings at \$34.13, not seasonally adjusted, were lower by \$0.52 (-1.5%) from the November 2020 estimate of \$34.65. The resultant November 2021 private sector weekly wage averaged \$1,163.83, lower by \$28.13 from a year ago (-2.4%). The Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U, U.S. City Average, not seasonally adjusted) in November 2021 was still rising, up 6.8% from a year ago. *Current all-employee private sector hours and earnings estimates can be volatile due to fluctuating sample responses.*

Labor Force Data (residential household survey)

The November 2021 unemployment rate for Connecticut was estimated by the BLS Local Area Unemployment Statistics program (LAUS) to be **6.0%** (seasonally adjusted), down by 0.4 percentage point from the October 2021 level of 6.4%. The Connecticut jobless rate was 8.2% in November 2020. The U.S. unemployment rate in November 2021 was 4.2%, down four-tenths of a percentage point from the October 2021 rate of 4.6% and below the 6.7% from one year ago.

Unemployment claims for first-time filers (seasonally adjusted) in Connecticut were an average of 3,266 per week in November 2021, down 236 (-6.7%) from the October 2021 (3,502) level and much lower by 3,806 claims (-53.8%) from the average weekly count of 7,072 in November 2020. This level of monthly average weekly initial claims (3,266) in the state is comparable to the February 2020 (3,243) count, just before the COVID lockdown.

Both the payroll (establishment) and household surveys request information about employment during the middle of the month. Therefore, results are not affected by events that happened late in the month. For example, we don't yet know what effect, if any, the emergence of the Omicron variant at the end of November had on job growth.

The nonfarm employment estimate, derived from a survey of businesses, is a measure of jobs in the state; the unemployment rate and labor force estimates are based on a household survey, and measure the work status of people who live in Connecticut. Overall, as the national and state economies recover, volatility in monthly numbers can be expected. **Job and employment estimates are best understood in the context of their movement over several months rather than observed changes in a single month's value.**

As a result of changes in the estimation procedures, you are likely to see more variability in month-to-month estimates of job counts. Caution should be used in interpreting any single month's estimate. The data are best interpreted to identify trends and cycles over several months and quarters. 


