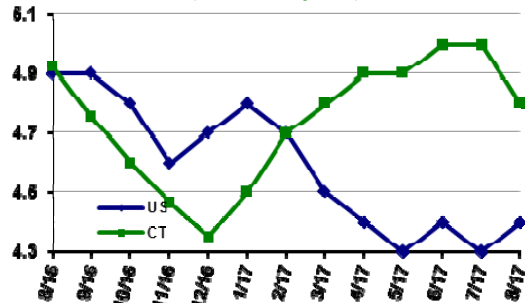

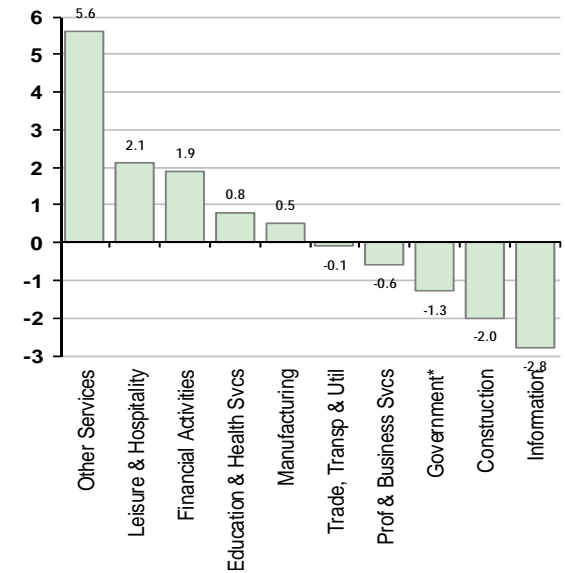

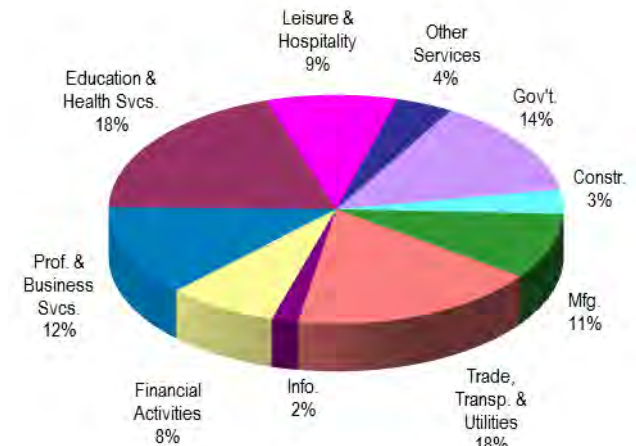
August 2016 - August 2017
