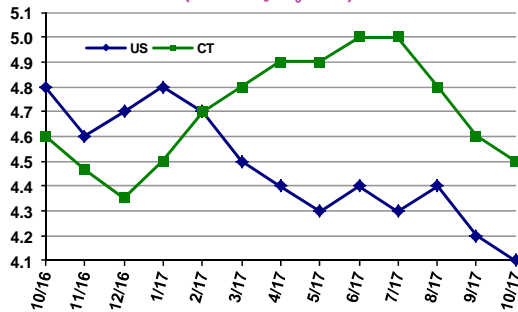

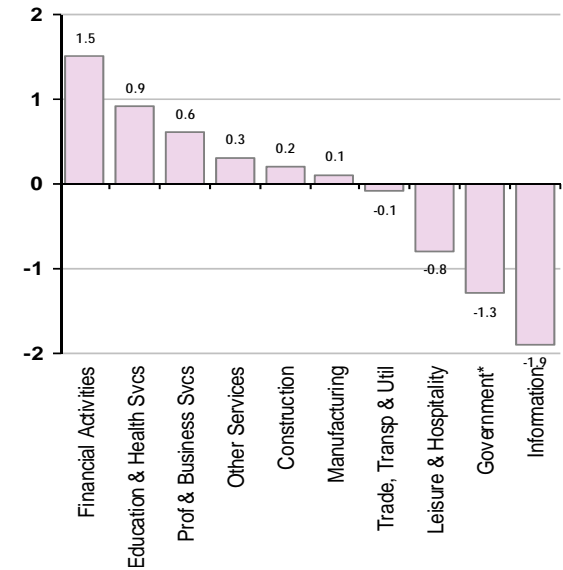

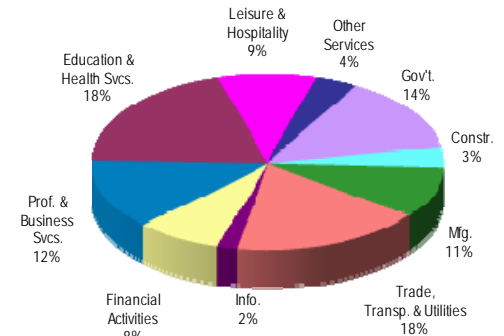
Net Job Change
