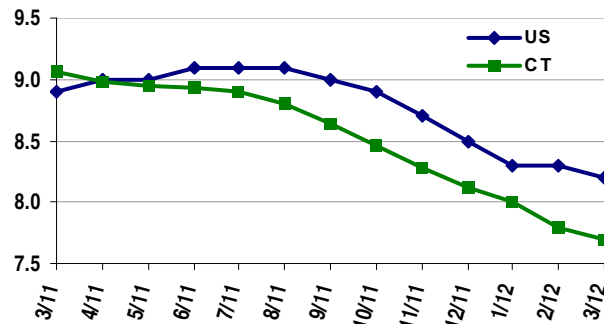

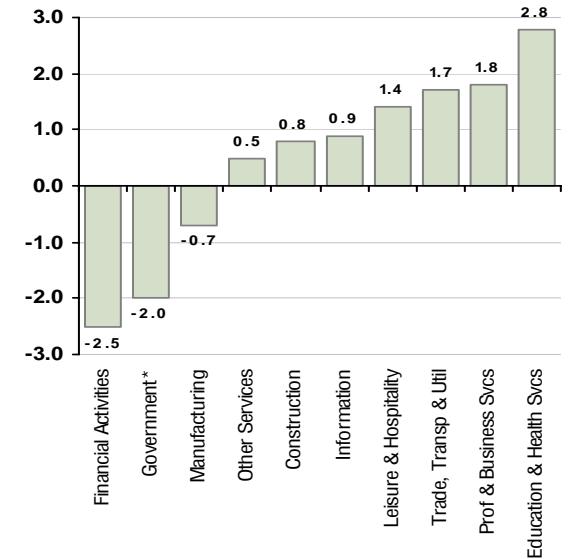

Net Job Change

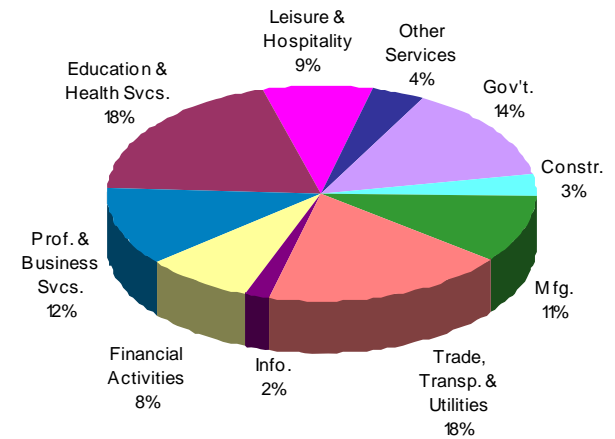
