Occupations with the most postings were **Retail Salespersons** (2,394 postings), **Registered Nurses** (2,020 postings), **Customer Service Representatives** (1,456 postings) **Supervisors of Retail Sales Workers** (1,352 postings) and **Sales Representatives, Wholesale and Manufacturing** (1,290 postings).

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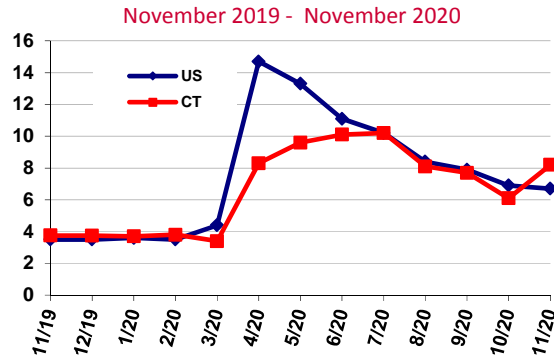

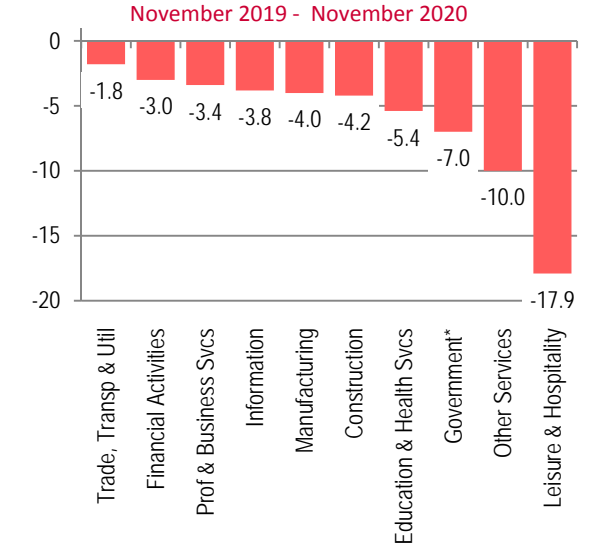

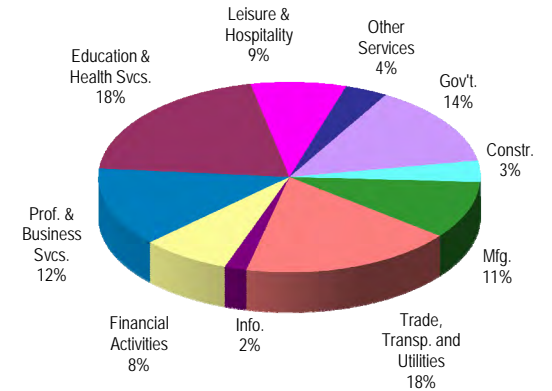
