

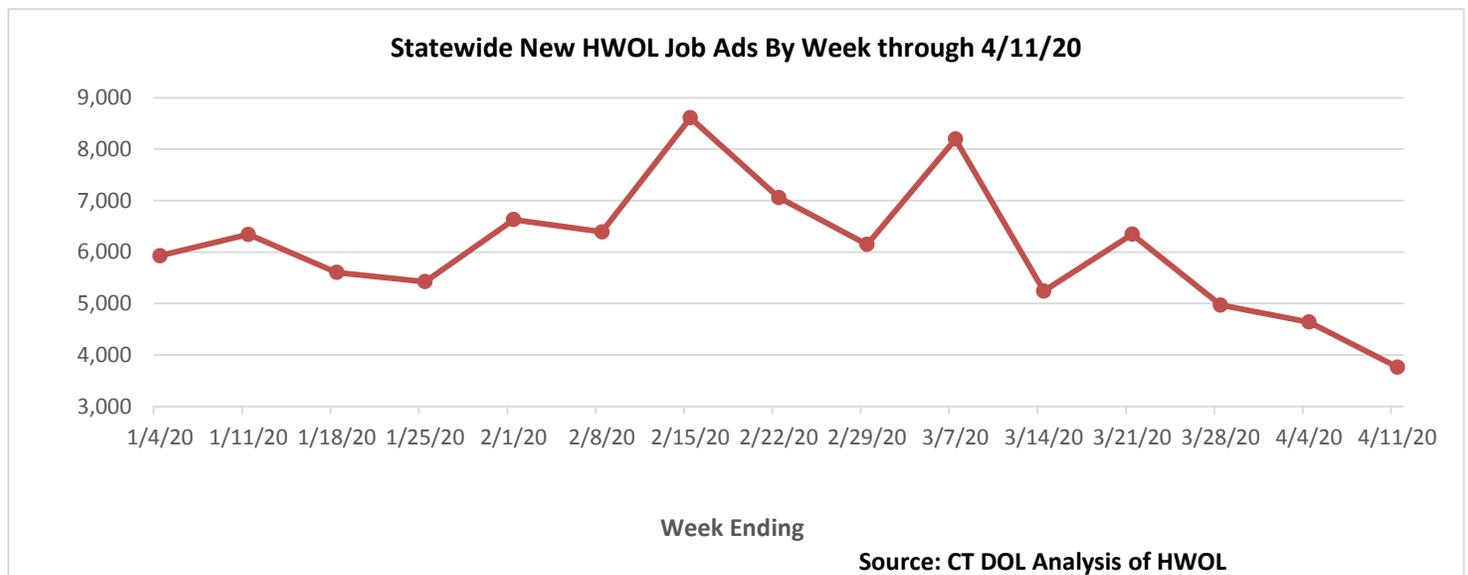


# NEW WEEKLY JOB ADS FROM HELP WANTED ONLINE

## Week Ending April 11, 2020

WETHERSFIELD, April 17, 2020 – During the week ending April 11, 2020, there were 3,764 new ads. This weekly level is down 19% from the week ending 4/4/20 and down 28% over 4 weeks. The industries with the largest 1-week percent increases were Transportation and Warehousing (+132 new ads or 171%) and Professional, Scientific, & Technical Services (+18 new ads or +8%). The industry with more new job ads over a four-week period was Transportation and Warehousing (+47 new ads or 29%).



## The three industries with the most new job ads were

- **Health Care and Social Assistance** (1,035 new ads, -12%),
- **Finance and Insurance** (350 new ads, -35%)
- **Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services** (238 new ads, +8%).

16 sectors had job ad decreases over the week and 4 sectors had increases. The largest decreases over the week occurred in Finance and Insurance (-187 new ads or 35%), Health Care and Social Assistance (-138 new ads or -12%) and Public Administration (-123 new ads or -59%). The largest increases occurred in Transportation and Warehousing (+132 new ads or 171%) and Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services (+18 new ads or 8%).

## Employers with the Most New Job Ads

The ten employers with the most weekly new job ads are mostly within Healthcare and Social Assistance, Public Administration, or Finance and Insurance.

- Registered Nurses (375 new ads, -1% over the week)
- Laborers and Freight, Stock, and Material Movers, Hand (325 new ads, +480% over the week)
- Computer Occupations, all others (158 new ads, -7% over the week).
