


NEW WEEKLY JOB ADS FROM HELP WANTED ONINE

Week Ending April 18, 2020

WETHERSFIELD, April 24, 2020 – During the week ending April 18, 2020, there were 3,764 new ads. This weekly level is down 2.3% from the week ending 4/11/20 and down 42.1% over 4 weeks. This top line decline was driven by Health Care and Social Assistance (-195 new ads or -19%) and Transportation and Warehousing (-162 new ads or -78%). The major industries with the largest 1-week percent increases were Construction (+16 new ads or 73%) and Real Estate, Rental, and Leasing (+15 new ads or +65%). The industry with the largest weekly change was Manufacturing (+103 new ads or 49%).



The three industries with the most new job ads were

- Health Care and Social Assistance (840 new ads, -19%),
- Finance and Insurance (434 new ads, +24%)
- Manufacturing (315 new ads, +49%).

12 sectors had job ad increases over the week and 8 sectors had decreases. The largest increases over the week occurred in Manufacturing (+103 new ads or +49%), Finance and Insurance (+84 new ads or +24%), and Retail Trade (+44 new ads or +20%). The largest decreases occurred in Health Care and Social Assistance (-195 new ads or -19%) and Transportation and Warehousing (-162 new ads or 8%).

Employers with the Most New Job Ads

The ten employers with the most weekly new job ads are mostly within Healthcare and Social Assistance, Public Administration, or Finance and Insurance. Raytheon represents the recent merger between UTC and Raytheon, and is the parent company of Pratt and Whitney.
