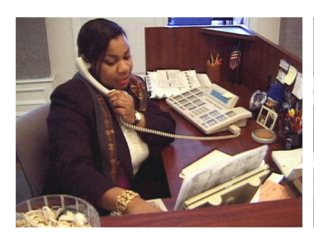

The data used to generate this report comes from the unemployment insurance system. Due to COVID-19 the number of unemployment claims has increased substantially so the numbers in this report may be much higher than those in recent quarters.”

**Connecticut Data for Affirmative Action Plans** provides labor force information for Connecticut and its eight counties. The data presented are designed to meet the requirements of the Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs (OFCCP) and/or the Connecticut Commission on Human Rights and Opportunities (CHRO) for companies, State agencies, and municipalities that submit an Affirmative Action Plan.

The job seekers listed in the "Characteristics of Job Seekers" tables are Unemployment Insurance claimants in the quarter. The demographics of these job seekers are the basis for the percentages used to estimate the Minority and Women Unemployed shown in "Estimated Minority and Women Unemployed" table.

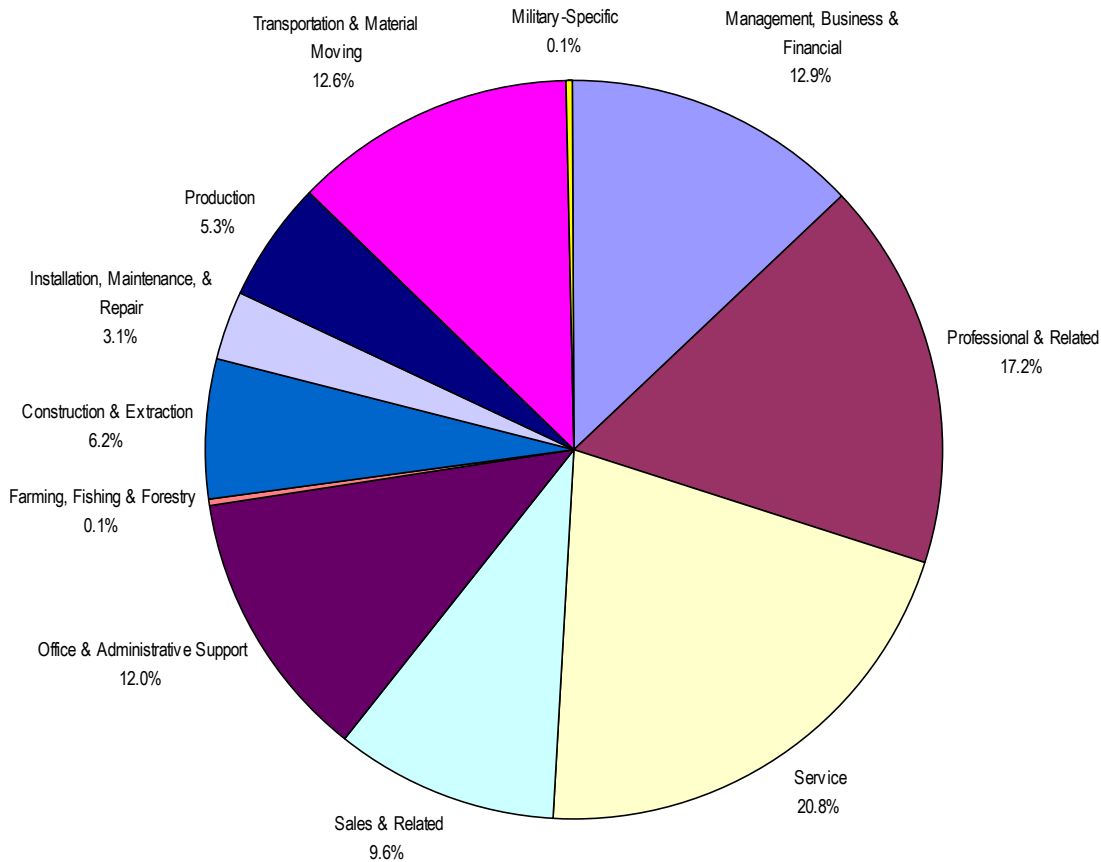
