Employment by Program of Study:

- Of the 21,323 Connecticut public college graduates, 65% were employed in Connecticut (CT) during the third quarter after graduation.
- The greatest number of employed graduates majored in Business, Management, Marketing & Related (2,282), followed by Liberal Arts & Sciences (2,140) and Health Professions & Related Programs (1,904).
- The rate of employed graduates by program of study ranged from a high of 90% for Communication Technologies/ Technicians to a low of 39% for Philosophy & Religious Studies.
- 60% of employed graduates were women, 9% were African American and 10% were Hispanic.
- Over 65% of employed graduates worked in firms with 100 or more employees; 39% worked in large firms of 500 or more employees.



Employment and Earnings by Industry:

- Over half (51%) of Connecticut's public college graduates employed in Connecticut during the third quarter after graduation were working in Health Care & Social Assistance (22%), Educational Services (16%) and Retail Trade (12%).
- The overall average quarterly earnings for graduates employed in the third quarter after graduation was \$9,217. Graduates working in Utilities had the highest average quarterly earnings (\$17,731).
- Compared to overall statewide employment, a greater percentage of graduates were employed in the Educational Services, Health Care & Social Assistance, Professional & Technical Services and Retail Trade industry sectors.

Employment by Industry and Degree Program:

- Graduates majoring in Business, Management, Marketing and Related were employed in a wide variety of industries, but over half (51%) were working in Finance & Insurance, Professional and Technical Services, Retail Trade and Manufacturing.
- Similarly, Liberal Arts and Sciences graduates were found to be working in virtually all industries, but almost half (51%) were working in Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, or Education Services.



- Of the 7,151 University of Connecticut (UCONN) graduates, 53% were employed in CT during the third quarter after graduation.
- The greatest number of employed graduates majored in Business, Management, Marketing & Related (626), following Health Professions and Related Programs (454) and Engineering (330).
- The rate of employed graduates by program of study ranged from a high of 70% for Public Admin. & Social Services Professions, to a low of 32% for Mathematics & Statistics.
- 55% of employed graduates were women.
- 69% of employed graduates worked in firms with 100 or more employees; 45% worked in large firms of 500 or more employees.



- Compared to overall statewide employment, a greater percentage of UCONN graduates were employed in the Educational Services, Health Care & Social Assistance, Professional & Technical Services, and Finance & Insurance industry sectors.





- Over one-quarter (29%) of the 934 CSUS graduates who majored in Business, Management, Marketing & Related and were employed in the third quarter after graduation were working in the Finance & Insurance (139) and Professional & Technical Services (131) sectors.







Employment by Industry and Degree Program:

- 26% of the 135 ECSU graduates who majored in Business, Management, Marketing & Related and were employed in the third quarter after graduation were working in the Professional & Technical Services (18) and Retail Trade (17) sectors.
- Over half (54%) of the 100 graduates who majored in Psychology and were employed in the third quarter after graduation were working in the Health Care & Social Assistance (29) and Educational Services (25) sectors.



Employment and Gender:

- Of the 738 ECSU female graduates, 77% were employed in the third quarter after graduation and 68% of the 504 male graduates were employed.





Employment by Industry and Degree Program:

- Almost half (49%) of the 187 WCSU graduates who majored in Business, Management, Marketing & Related and were employed in the third quarter after graduation were working in the Professional & Technical Services (35), Retail Trade (24), Administrative & Support (17) and Finance & Insurance (15) sectors.
- 42% of the 53 graduates who majored in Psychology and were employed in the third quarter after graduation were working in the Health Care & Social Assistance (22) sector.



- Of the 675 WCSU female graduates, 74% were employed in the third quarter after graduation and 70% of the 480 male graduates were employed.
- For both females and males, those who majored in Health Professions & Related Programs had the highest employment rate (84% and 79%, respectively).
- Half (50%) of the 498 female graduates employed during the third quarter after graduation were working in the Health Care & Social Assistance (154) and Educational Services (94) sectors; 33% of the 338 employed male graduates were working in the Retail Trade (64) and Educational Services (49) sectors.

Employment by Industry and Degree Program:

- Over one-third (36%) of the 75 CCC graduates who majored in Liberal Arts & Sciences and were employed in the third quarter after graduation were working in the Health Care & Social Assistance sector.
- Almost all (80%) of the 147 graduates who majored in Health Professions & Related Science and were employed in the third quarter after graduation were working in the Health Care & Social Assistance sector.



- Of the 351 CCC female graduates, 79% were employed in the third quarter after graduation; 80% of the 132 male graduates were employed.
- For females, those who majored in Business Management & Administration had the highest employment rate (85%); for males, the highest employment rate was also for those who majored in Homeland Security & Law Enforcement (100%).
- More than half (55%) of the 278 female graduates employed during the third quarter after graduation, and nearly half (48%) of the 106 employed male graduates were working in the Health Care & Social Assistance sector.



Department of Labor Programs

Jobs First Employment Services (JFES)

Program Description: *Jobs First* is Connecticut's time-limited public assistance program for needy families with dependent children. The program emphasizes assisting families to attain economic independence through employment. The Connecticut Department of Labor (DOL) operates a Jobs First Employment Services (JFES) Program as a major component of *Jobs First*. Effective 10/1/97, Connecticut's state plan to operate a *Jobs First* program was approved by U.S. Health and Human Services.

Activities: Based on an assessment and test results, the Jobs First Employment Services (JFES) Program case managers develop individualized employment plans with each participant. The Employment Plans are designed to assist participants to reach the program goals of becoming and remaining independent of cash assistance within the State's twenty-one month time limit while meeting the federal participation requirements. JFES operates on a "Balanced Work First Approach" that emphasizes obtaining immediate employment whenever possible, but also combines work and work activities with education and/or training in order to increase earnings potential and the probability of remaining independent of cash assistance. The following table contains information regarding the types of activities and service provided to participants through the JFES program.

Trade Adjustment Assistance (TAA)

Program Description: The Trade Act of 1974 provides assistance to workers whose employment is adversely affected by increased imports or shifts of production to foreign countries.

Services: TAA includes a variety of benefits and reemployment services to help unemployed workers prepare for and obtain suitable employment. Workers may be eligible for training, a relocation allowance, and other reemployment services. Additionally, weekly Trade Readjustment Allowances (TRA) may be payable to eligible workers following the exhaustion of unemployment benefits. Generally, these benefits are payable only when an individual is enrolled in training. In some instances, for workers 55 and older, there can be a wage subsidy through Alternative Trade Adjustment Assistance

What are the quantities and types of services provided? The program costs listed below represent the dollars associated with the purchase of training and related expenses, relocation allowances and job search allowances, as well as program administration dollars. The *Services Delivered* figures do not represent all services and assessments received by TAA clients.

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Wagner-Peyser

Program Summary: The Wagner-Peyser Act of 1933 established a nationwide system of public employment offices. The mission of this Act is to assist job seekers in finding jobs and employers in finding qualified workers. Through federal funding provided by this program, the Connecticut Department of Labor provides a variety of employment-related labor exchange services to job seekers and employers. It is the only universal access employment-related program available and services are provided at no charge to clients and employers. Wagner-Peyser is one of the required programs under WIA and provides the core services that are the foundation of the one-stop system in Connecticut known as American Job Centers.

Activities: Employment-related labor exchange services may include, but are not limited to job search assistance, job referral and placement assistance for job seekers, reemployment services to unemployment insurance claimants and recruitment services to employers with job openings. Depending on the needs of the labor market, services such as job seeker assessment of skill levels, abilities and aptitudes, career guidance, job search workshops and referral to training may also be available. In addition to referral of job seekers to available job openings, employer services may include assistance in development of job posting requirements; matching job seeker experience with job requirements, skills and other attributes; assisting employers with special recruitment needs; arranging career fairs; assisting employers in analyzing hard-to-fill job openings; assisting with job restructuring; and helping employers handle layoffs.

CT.jobs is Connecticut's state labor exchange system. It is a self-service job bank that provides a range of employment services for both job seekers and business, including the preliminary and broad matching of job seekers to potential employers based on qualifications, desired location, salary, and other criteria. CT.jobs enables job seekers to search thousands of employment opportunities representing all types of occupations and refer themselves to positions of interest. Job seekers can post their résumé online for approved business representatives to view. Approved Connecticut businesses can post job openings and search the résumé bank for qualified candidates at no cost. Technical assistance is provided to both employers and job seekers.

Please note that, due to methodology differences, that the Legislative Report Card summaries will not necessarily agree with the Federal reporting done by the Performance Measures Unit of the CT Department of Labor.

Introduction:

There are three funding streams to the state and local areas: adults, dislocated workers and youth. Eighty-five percent (85%) of adult and youth funds are allocated to local areas with the remainder (15% Governor's Reserve) reserved for state administration and other statewide activities. Sixty percent (60%) of dislocated worker funds are allocated to the Workforce Investment Boards (WIBs) to provide employment and training services with fifteen percent (15% Governor's Reserve) reserved for state administration and other statewide activities and twenty-five percent (25%) reserved for rapid response activities.

Pursuant to the Workforce Investment Act (WIA) (effective July 1, 1998), the Governor designated the CTDOL:

- 1. the administrative financial agency for WIA
- 2. the labor market information/statewide employment statistics agency for WIA
- 3. the agency to administer the statewide list of providers/ approved programs for employment and training services under WIA, and
- 4. the agency charged with Performance Measurement requirements under WIA.

The report begins with adult and dislocated services and is followed by the report on youth services.

WIA Title IB - Adults and Dislocated Workers

Program Summary: The Workforce Investment Act (WIA), Chapter 5, section 131 authorizes adult and dislocated worker employment and training services. This legislation is meant to streamline services within the One-Stop environment (*American Job Centers*), to empower individuals to make choices about their training through individual training accounts (ITAs), and to provide universal access to self-services. The system is intended to be customer-focused, and to help individuals access the tools they need to manage their careers.

Activities: Individuals may participate in Core, Intensive and Training services. All participants may receive core services. Core Services for both Adults and Dislocated Workers include:

- Job Search Assistance
- Career Counseling
- Job Referrals
- Job Development
- Workshops and Job Clubs

Based upon financial need and other barriers, an individual may progress into the Intensive, and finally, Training services. Intensive Services for both Adults and Dislocated Workers include:

- Assessment
- Developing and Individual Employment Plan
- Group Counseling
- Individual Counseling and Career Planning
- Case Management
- Short Term Pre-Vocational Services
- Out of Area Job Search Assistance
- Literacy Act Services
- Relocation Assistance
- Internships
- Work Experience Programs



All of these services are available within the *American Job Centers* and can be interchanged with other co-located partner program services according to an individual's needs.

Once the need for training services has been determined, an individual may be given an Individual Training Account (ITA), which they may use to pay for training of their choice. This training program must be chosen from a Statewide Eligible Training Program (Provider) List.

Training Services for both Adults and Dislocated Workers include:

- Occupational Skills Training
- On-the-Job Training
- Private Sector Training Programs
- Skill Upgrading and Retraining
- Entrepreneurial Training
- Adult Education, basic skills and/or literacy in combination with any other training
- Customized Training
- Co-Op

WIA Title IB - Youth

Program Summary: The Workforce Investment Act, Chapter 4, section 126 authorizes funds to provide workforce investment activities for eligible youth. The legislation and regulations stress a new approach to serving youth. Youth services are considered to be long –term, with involvement lasting at least a year. Long and short-term goals are set with the youth so they can achieve educational and vocational benchmarks in preparation for the world of work. Educational achievement and retention is priority for younger youth, while employability skills and employment focus is acceptable for older youth (19-21).

Activities: Youth activities are divided into three categories:

- Work-Related: Paid and Unpaid Work Experience, Occupational Skills Training, Adult Mentoring, and Guidance/ Counseling
- Academic: Tutoring, Alternative School, Leadership Development, Adult Mentoring, and Guidance/Counseling
- Summer Related: Summer Employment

What are the quantity and types of services delivered?

The following table illustrates the quantities of the different activities given to youth over the past three years. A direct comparison is difficult to make as we are comparing different programs and legislation with very different philosophies. This is evident by the different activity categories.
